During the seminar attendees will:

- Learn to develop training strategies for solving behavior problems.
- Implement behavior modification with selected park animals (wolves, coyote, foxes and bison).
- Learn to work in cooperation with other trainers to develop a team approach to training.
- Develop and practice protected contact approaches to insure both animal and trainer safety throughout the sessions.
- Attend lecture and group discussion in between the “hands on” training sessions.
- Come prepared to work outside and in close proximity to all animals participating in this 3 days of learning and fun!

For safety with the animals please be aware that if you are sick, injured or otherwise unable to walk steadily on your feet you may not be able to safely interact with some of the animals inside their enclosures. However, there will be other training opportunities with the foxes, and through the use of protected contact.

Please note: Wolf Park’s animal care staff reserves the right to ask any trainer at any time to stop training any of Wolf Park’s animals if they deem it is necessary for the safety and well-being of all concerned.
